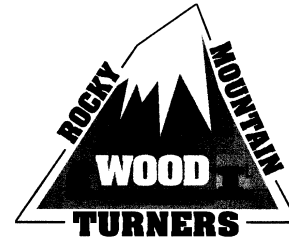

The Utah Woodturning Symposium is a family affair dedicated to the education of woodturners around the world. In its 28 year, the longest running symposium hosted 437 participants and showcased 23 demonstrators. Professor Kip Christensen heads up the three day event held at Brigham Young University in Provo, Utah. Kip's expertise keeps the symposium operating smoothly. The schedule is full and is kicked off each year with a social gathering Wednesday night at Mike & Jenny Mahoney's beautiful home in nearby Orem. Thursday morning begins the demonstrator introductions and a breakfast buffet treat, then for the next three days participants have a choice of 100 rotations, 7 evening presentations, plus the "great egg-cup race", the swap meet and barbecue; a menu to satisfy the largest appetite.

Richard Raffan, Allan & Stuart Batty, and Dale Nish were long time repeat presenters backed up by an all-star supporting cast including Johannes Rieber, Terry Scott, Stuart Mortimer, the list goes on, one and all world-class artists.

I had a full rotation schedule (6 rotations plus 1 evening session) and still managed to see Max Krimmel work his alabaster magic, Michael Werner make one of his signature off-center pieces, and Jason

Marlow doing Celtic bowls. I also peeked in on Vaughn Richman talking about hot melt glue chucking techniques, and never to be missed, Dale Nish “working green wood”. The Stuart Batty (and father Allan banter) “Everything about the Bowl Gouge” was educational and entertaining. Cindy Drozda and I preformed our “Right Brain/Left Brain” demonstration twice and received rave reviews. There was so much more I couldn’t see, but then, there is next year.

The “Great Egg-Cup Race” is always a well attended evening session that showcases some of the best turners in the world making some of the worst looking cups-but fast. Many participants also get into the act with fun and prizes awarded in various categories.

I think a “cup” was made in less than 20 seconds. Stuart Batty and Johannes Rieber had the distinction of fastest and best cups. We had some very good young turners participate as well.

Great weather accompanied the barbecue Friday night in beautiful Rock Canyon Park overlooking Provo. Students at BYU sponsor the feed; everyone left smiling. The Swap Meet followed. Participants exchanged wood and tools in a low key market environment.

This is one of the finest symposiums available to the woodturners; always well organized, well attended, with tremendous demonstrations and in an atmosphere that is friendly to young or experienced, new or old. It’s about exchange of ideas and raising the level of woodturning in the world today.

Hey woodturners! We have three model 90 Powermatic wood lathes that were donated to us by CSU. The one that I have runs on 120 volt, single phase. The two that are at Dan Bailey's, run on 480 volt 3 phase. There is only one banjo, no tool rests or any other accessory. Dan Bailey has purchased a converter for one that he has so that it will run on either 120 or 240 volts. I'm not sure which voltage. The bidding on that lathe will begin at \$500. 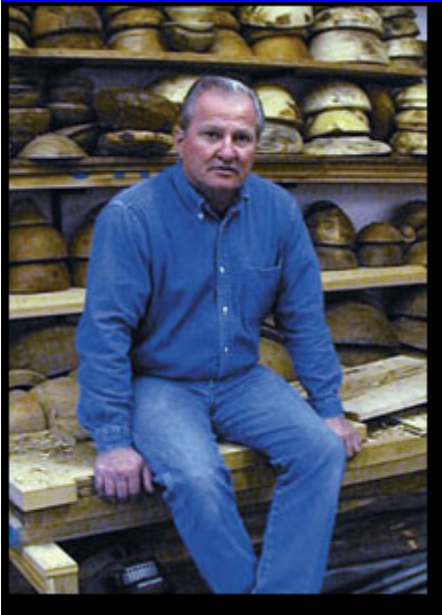
